DEVELOPING LEARNING DISPOSITIONS

At Gardner Road Kindergarten we use 'Learning Dispositions' to understand children's ability to be

self-motivated and to be life long learners in a changing world. Learning dispositions are characteristics or attitudes to learning that are life skills. Taking responsibility, persistence when faced with difficulties, and coping with change are all dispositions or ways children respond to learning. These are closely aligned with the key competencies in the New Zealand curriculum used in primary schools.

Planned experiences and the way teachers respond to children as they learn, support children's dispositions to persist, find interests, select and assess their own learning goals, and take an active part in the programme.

Children who see themselves as someone who tries new things, keeps going when it is hard, knows when to stop and ask for help, learns from making mistakes and has good support networks, are children who will be successful in an unknown world.

The posts go up at around 7pm each Friday evening, so if you are not following us on social media, please do so, and we hope you enjoy the content.

SUNHATS/CLOTHING

Sunhats are compulsory for Term 1. NO HAT, NO OUTSIDE PLAY. Please also ensure that your child has spare clothes in their bag and that they are named. We have very little spare clothing at Kindergarten.

DON'T FORGET TO PACK A SUNHAT, SPARE CLOTHES AND PUT SUNSCREEN ON YOUR CHILD

FOOD ALLERGIES

We have some children at Kindergarten who have allergies to various foods. Please do not send peanut butter, hard boiled eggs, loose nuts, yoghurt in pottles (pouch is OK). These foods put other children at risk.

Also, don't forget to pack a drink bottle filled with water only! Thank you.

SIGN IN SHEETS

It is really important that the sign in and out times are recorded clearly and that you sign in and out each time your child attends. Please do not let your child scribble or write on these sheets. You have a 15 minute window either side of the session start and finish time and so you can record times for arriving between 8.45am and 9.00am and leaving between 2.30pm and 2.45pm. If arriving after 9.00am or leaving before 2.30pm, we ask that you record the time as either 9.00am or 2.30pm. We appreciate your support.

Important Information

KORERO/COMMUNICATION

We communicate with you in a variety of ways - email, noticeboards, communication pockets, Storypark, Facebook and Instagram. We try to keep these all updated and current. We put Community posts on Storypark so don't forget to read those when you get an email notification. Also don't forget to check your communication pocket at Kindergarten regularly. We also have a daily whiteboard that tells you what has happened throughout the day. We hope this prompts a discussion between you and your child about what they have done during the day - rather than 'nothing'!

From time to time we also need to use the Text Facility to alert you to emails that we have sent you. We hear this has worked successfully in the past. It is really important that all your details are kept up to date such as email addresses, mobile phone numbers etc, as we use this form of communication in an emergency.

DROP OFF/PICK UP TIMES

Drop off time - Our session starts at 8.45am. We would appreciate it if you are on time, quickly settle your child and leave. Not only does this help to free up parking but more importantly it helps the children settle into their Kindergarten day more guickly and ensures a guiet start to the day. Pick up time - Because the children are on the mat having a story at the end of the day, we ask that you only come in earlier than 2.45pm if you would like to take your child straight away. Otherwise, please wait outside until the teacher opens the door at approximately 2.40pm. If you do come in, please leave as quickly, quietly and promptly as possible. Hopefully this will mean there is as little disruption as possible at story time. It is very difficult for the children to focus on the story and difficult

for the Teacher to sustain the children's attention with so many interruptions.

During a child's 'Graduation' ceremony it is particularly disruptive so please be patient if we ask you to wait. We really appreciate your cooperation with this.

When you do come in at the end of the day, please move forward to the mat area where the children are waiting. This makes it much easier for the teachers to see you and farewell your children.

We would also like to remind you that our carpark is not a playground. Please discourage your children from running around the church as there are vehicles often moving in this space. Please keep this area clear at the end of the day. Thank you.

CHILD SELF MANAGEMENT

Please continue to encourage your child's independence when they arrive at Kindergarten as it helps with their transition to school. We have noticed a lot of parents and caregivers carrying their child's bag. We will be encouraging the children to do this themselves so please reinforce this at home.

Some other ways you can encourage this independence is by -

- > choosing their own hook and hanging up their own bag,
- > providing a lunch box and drink bottle that your child can open and close independently,
- > dress them in clothes and shoes that they can manage to put on and take off themselves,
- > encourage them to greet the teacher at the door by name, especially if they are four years old.

PARENT HELPERS

As a Community Kindergarten, we really need and value your help during our session, even if it's just for an hour. If you are able to help anytime between 9am – 12 please put your name up on our roster just inside the front door. Parent helping gives you a chance to see what happens at Kindergarten, but most importantly, you child loves having you here. You are welcome to bring younger siblings also. Grandparents, Aunties, Uncles, etc are also welcome!

KINDERGARTEN WASHING

We would really appreciate it if you could take a turn at least once a term to wash the bag of towels and tea towels that is left at the door each day. There is no hurry for these to be returned the next day. Please wash them in a hot, separate wash. Near the end of the term, there may be items from the Family play area that need to be washed also. Thank you.

We love it when you engage with our posts on story park, please continue to comment and give us your feedback.

Our funding rate from the Ministry of Education is \$16.80 per child per hour and \$10.04 for non 20 hours

children respectively.
